ABOUT THE PEOPLE

The Karanga of Chad are a people group that belong to the larger Bantu people cluster. In Chad, the Karanga number around 110,000 and speak the Karanga language, which is also called Koniere. They likely live in a small area outside of the city of Abeche, which is in Southern Chad.

The Karanga people likely make their living by farming. Their crops probably include groundnuts, sesame, grains and wheat. However, because of the extremely dry climate of the desert, farming is often difficult. In addition, crops in this region have recently been damaged due to grain-eating birds.

All in all, there is extremely little known about the Karanga of Chad. Much prayer and petition is needed to see these people come to a knowledge of the One True God made manifest in the person of Jesus.
